Mission

The Kansas Office of Broadband Development (KOBD) was established in 2020 to help ensure all Kansans have the opportunity to live, work, learn, and compete in a global economy by improving universal access to quality, affordable, and reliable broadband.





Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

- BEAD Broadband Equity Access and Deployment
 - Planning Grant
 - Provides \$5M to states to build capacity, conduct research and data collection, training, and other needs
 - Funds expected early 2023
- Competitive Grants Released- Fall 2023
 - Minimum of \$100 Million per state
 - Contingent upon mapping





Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

- DEA Digital Equity Act Programs
 - State Digital Equity Planning: (\$60M) for states and territories to develop digital equity plans
 - Approved funding for Kansas is \$692,000
 - State Digital Equity Capacity: (\$1.44B) annual formula grant program for states and territories to implement digital equity projects and support local implementation plans
 - Digital Equity Competitive: (\$1.25B) annual competitive grant program to implement digital equity projects

Language

- Digital Equity
 - NDIA: The condition in which all individuals and communities have the information technology capacity needed for full participation in our society, democracy, and economy

Digital Inclusion

- Includes affordable connectivity, devices, and digital skill literacy
- The activities necessary to ensure that all, including most disadvantaged, have access to robust broadband connections, internet-enabled devices that meet their needs; and the skills to explore, create and succeed in the digital world





Language

- Digital Adoption
 - Individuals and groups who have access to broadband and choose to subscribe to broadband

Digital Skills (Literacy)

• An individual's ability to find, evaluate, and clearly communicate information through typing and other media on various digital platforms



Eligible Areas

Recipients may use these funds to make critical investments in broadband infrastructure in underserved areas

- Areas without access to reliable speeds of 100 Mbps download / 20 Mbps upload
- Provide latency of less than 100 milliseconds
- Eligible entities must provide a middle-class affordability and low-cost service options
- Must participate in Affordable Connectivity Program
- Must include robust stakeholder engagement in formation of five-year plans

Eligible Costs

Capital expenses directly related to the deployment of a qualified broadband project, including:





Ineligible Costs

Obligation / Debt Servicing

- Satisfaction of any obligation
- Payment of interest or principal on outstanding debt instruments

Operational Expenses

- Operating expenses
- Short-term operation leases
- Maintenance expenses related to the project.
- Indirect labor costs (fringe/benefits, travel, meals, lodging, paid time off, etc.)

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Capital Assets / Infrastructure

- Acquisition of spectrum licenses
- Infrastructure not directly connected to service provision for an end-user in the proposed area
- Long-term capital asset purchases/leases, although cost allocation for use during the project period will be considered on a case-by-case basis



State Program – Broadband Acceleration Grant (BAG)

- Funded in 2020 through the IKE Transportation Plan
- 10 year, \$85M competitive grant for broadband infrastructure
- Funding is \$5M/year in 2021-2023, and \$10M/year in 2024-2030
- Projects require a 50% match
- Areas covered must lack 25/3 service



Offers Internet equipment and software at low or no cost




Narrows adoption disparities across covered populations by engaging with diverse stakeholders


Implements digital inclusion programs that include digital skills and literacy training , technical support and workforce development
