

FUNDING SOURCES

TOOLS TO HELP

Helping members and others access funding for a variety of projects having an impact in the region and beyond.

Overview of Funding Sources

- » A project might be funded by a variety of sources
- » NCRPC staff can help determine the best fit
- Local investment, foundations and smaller sources of funds are also important
- Communities need to be prepared to invest in themselves and their priority projects

Kansas Housing Resources Corporation

- » Weatherization Assistance Program
- » Moderate Income Housing (MIH)
- » Kansas Housing Investor Tax Credit (KHITC)
- » Low Income Housing Investor Tax Credit (LIHTC)
- » First Time Home Buyer-Accessed through Lender
- » National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF)
- » HOME Funds

Kansas Department of Health & Environment

- » Kansas Public Water Supply Loan Fund
 - » Loans for water projects for city or RWD systems.
 - » Loans are 20 years at below market interest rates
- » Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund
 - » Loans for publicly owned wastewater treatment systems
 - » Maximum loan period is 20 years. Interest rates are approximately 60% of market rate

Kansas Department of Commerce

- » The KS Department of Commerce distributes federal funds to Kansas cities and counties through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program
- » Projects must meet one of the following criteria:
 - » Benefit low-and moderate-income individuals
 - » Removes or prevents slum or blight condition
 - » Eliminates an urgent need immediately after occurrence, created by a disaster

CDBG Categories

» Annual Competitive Round

- » Varies each year
- » In the past Water, Sewer, Community Facilities
- » Housing Rehabilitation & Demolition
- » Economic Development
- » Urgent Need
- » Commercial Rehabilitation
- » New Child Care, Architectural Barrier Removal, parks, sidewalks, Trails

CDBG Eligibility

- » At least 51% of the population benefiting must be of low- and moderate-income (LMI)
- » If this cannot be verified through Census data, a LMI survey is required
- » Surveys are often useable for several years
- » NCRPC will assist in tabulation, etc.
- No survey is required for Housing Rehabilitation
 & Demolition
- » Some projects qualify on the basis of slum and blight removal OR serving limited clientele

Kansas Department of Commerce

- » Several new programs
- » Seeking outside funding that is NOT federal to allow flexibility
- » Examples: SEED and HEAL
- » Programs that likely will go away BASE and others that were Federal funds related to Covid.

Kansas Creative Arts & Attraction & Development Funding

- » Larger grant pool focused on substantial tourism attraction
- » Small grant pool focused on
 - » Art installation such as murals
 - » Exhibits and visiting artists
 - Helping strengthen non-profits in the arts to be more sustainable
 - » Events that are arts focused

Federal Emergency Management Administration

- » Assistance to Firefighters Grants (AFG)
 - » Vehicle Acquisition
 - » Operations and Safety (i.e. training, equipment, personal protective equipment, modifications to facilities, and wellness/fitness services)
 - » Be aware of training requirements

USDA Rural Development

- » Community Facilities
 - Develops essential rural community facilities including health care, telecommunications, public safety and public services
- » Water and Wastewater Grant/Loan Program
 - Assists communities in developing water and waste disposal systems
 - » Loan is 40 year term, less than market rate
 - » Grant is paired with loan to keep rates reasonable

Rural Development

» Single Family Housing

- » Direct Loans (very low & low income)
- » Housing Loan Guarantees (LMI Americans)
- » Housing Repair Loans/Grants (very low & low income)
- » Rural Rental Housing
 - » Housing Direct Loans (very low income)
 - Housing Loan Guarantees (very low to moderate income)
- » Farm Labor Housing Loans/Grants (affordable rental)
- » Housing Preservation Grants (very low & low income)

Kansas Department of Transportation

» CCLIP

- » Safe Routes for All Federal program that works in cooperation with KDOT pedestrian focus +
- » Local Bridge Improvement Program
- » Short line rail improvement fund part of economic development funding
- » Local Cost-share program
- » Airport improvements
- » Adding Charging stations

Kansas State Historical Society

- » Heritage Trust Fund Grant Program
 - » Grants for activities that preserve or restore historic properties
- » State Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credit Program
 - » State income tax credit equal to 25% of rehabilitation expenses for historic buildings

Office of Rural Prosperity

- » Programming and Funding
- » Annual Conference
- » Community Champions
- Developing rural focused efforts for Kansas
 Department of Commerce: HEAL & SEED
- » Kansas Murals
- » Rural Opportunity Zones (ROZ)

Community Service Tax Credits

- » Kansas Department of Commerce administers the program
- An avenue for non-profit organizations to improve their ability to undertake major capital fund-raising drives for various projects
- » Tax credit of 70% if the organization is located in a community with population less than 15,000. Otherwise 50% tax credit applies
- » Eligible projects for tax credit awards include community service, crime prevention, youth and health care

Traditional Finance Options

- » Revenue Bonds
- » General Obligation Bonds
- » Lease Purchase Arrangements
- Consultation with a Bond Attorney or a Municipal Finance Firm
